DO YOU KNOW WHO THE PEOPLE ARE ON OUR BANK NOTES? LET'S FIND OUT - THEY HAVE DONE SOME PRETTY COOL THINGS!

\$100 - Lord Ernest Rutherford is on our \$100 note. ...

He is called the 'father of the atom' because he helped change the understanding of atomic science, and determined the structure of the atom!

\$50 - Sir Apirana Ngata is on our \$50 note. He worked hard to encourage Maori culture and language, and was the first Maori to graduate from a New Zealand university and was a Member of Parliament for 38 years.

\$20 - Queen Elizabeth II is on our \$20 note.

The picture of her is an official portrait that was taken when she visited New Zealand in 1986. She is wearing the Sovereign's Badge of the Order of New Zealand.

\$10 - Kate Sheppard is on our \$10 note.

She campaigned for women to be allowed to vote in New Zealand. Her campaign worked because in 1893 New Zealand became the first country in the world to let women vote!

\$5 - Sir Edmund Hillary is on our \$5 note. ...

He was the first person in the world to climb Mt Everest in Nepal in 1953, and in 1958 he was the first to drive overland to the South Pole on a Massey Ferguson tractor!

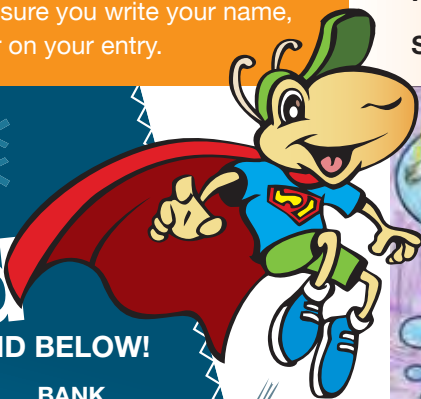
